National Tsing Hua University College of Life Sciences and Medicine Establishment Guidelines for the Biological Resources Conservation and Breeding Research Center

- I. These guidelines are formulated based on the National Tsing Hua University Research Centers Establishment Guidelines (國立清華大學研究中心設置要點).
- II. The Biological Resources Conservation and Breeding Research Center (hereafter referred to as "the Center") aims to promote ecological conservation through teaching, research, and knowledge dissemination, actively collaborating and interacting with other institutions to preserve biodiversity.
- III. The organizational structure of the Center is as follows: The Center shall have five members on its establishment committee, recommended by the Dean. The committee members shall mutually elect a convener, who shall be appointed by the Dean. The convener's term is three years and may be renewed; the reappointment of the convener is at the discretion of the Dean following due consultation procedures. The convener is responsible for overseeing all matters of the Center.
- IV. The Center may appoint an executive secretary and other staff members as needed to assist in handling various affairs.
- V. The missions of the Center include:
  - 1. Planning and proposing the addition of ecological conservation-related courses and assisting in their implementation.
  - 2. Organizing various ecological tours and academic events related to research.
  - Promoting cooperation and connections with domestic and international research institutions, scholars, and students engaged in ecological conservation and biodiversity preservation.
- VI. The Center shall undergo assessment by College Affairs Meeting every three years. If it fails to pass, it shall be discussed by a College Affairs Meeting and Research Development Meeting, and upon approval, it shall be submitted to University Affairs Development Committee for final approval and termination if necessary.
- VII. These guidelines, after being approved by the Center Meeting, College Affairs Meeting, and

Research Development Meeting, are implemented following approval by University Affairs Development Committee, and the same process applies for amendments.
